Experience him demonstrating his skills with **popular melodies** such as the Sailors Hornpipe and the Flying Scotsman.

Gemma Donald showcases **lively fiddle playing** at its very best and was the youngest winner of the prestigious Glenfiddich Fiddle Championships in 2006.
